There is also the ever-important campus recruitment process that worries students. Mentors give them clarity and address this uncertainty about cracking their first job.

Title: *Student Mentoring Policy*

Goal:

The purpose of mentoring is to help students connect into the knowledge of those with more experience than themselves and learn faster than they would on their own. It's also an opportunity to grow their network and connect with leaders rather than only their peers.

The target of this Mentoring Programme is to identify fundamental mechanisms that will

1. Provide students with career and non-academic counselling.
2. Provide students with information on preparatory courses such as skill courses, bridge courses etc. for their academic prosperity.
3. Focus and motivate students to achieve learning goals and thereby improve their academic performance.
4. Guide, encourage, and advice the students about their upcoming student life, student health, mental and emotional well-being and listen to their issues with patience and help them solve their concerns with appropriate resources, support and referral available.
5. Generate curiosity and interest in academics and other institutional activities amongst the students.

Context:

College is established with the aim of providing the higher educational needs and aspirations of the students of the hill area of Mandakini valley of district Rudraprayag of Uttarakhand. A diverse section of the students especially from remote and rural background are getting opportunity to have access to the various academic programmes for attaining growth and excellence. In keeping with the college's objective to provide quality education to the students admitted in various subject areas, the college has science, arts, commerce faculties and B.Ed. (Professional courses under self finance mode). In the context of to ensure the quality education in the College, mentoring may be recognized as a strategy for the students to achieve learning goals with emotional and instrumental support. Thus, the student mentorship programme will incorporate the support of faculty members as "Mentors" to all the students in the college. Each student shall be assigned a "Mentor" to overcome their hurdles to achieve the goals desired by them in their academic career.

The Practice:

Mentorship is important because it provides students with the opportunity to develop and become more competent in their life as well as prepare for growth opportunities in the future.

For effective mentoring, the mentor should embrace the ability and willingness to-

1. Teacher to advise the students on how to accomplish their goals
2. Provide guidance and help to increase the student's exposure to new experiences.
3. Counsel to enhance the student's self-esteem through supportive, non-judgmental discussions.
4. Share experiences and be open to sharing mistakes, failures and lessons learned.
5. Maintain strict confidentiality of the information shared by the student.
6. If at any time, the mentor feel, the student need special counselling, the mentor may encourage the student to seek counselling with the professional expert.

7. If any student needs special academic tutoring, the mentor may direct the mentees to an appropriate faculty and may even ask the faculty to help their mentees in a particular area.

Evidence of Success:

Since the mentoring programme is launched in college, maximum attendance of the students is recorded in the class rooms of every subject. Numbers of queries are increasing every year regarding problems encountered in study/academic related by UG previous and second semester/year students and carrier oriented by UG final year and PG students. It is also observed that the students are showing their keen interest in class and are more expressive (using more words to explain), listening more actively and asking more questions (showing their perspective on topic).

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Lack of resources (at present mentor, mentee's ratio is 1:62, which is too large).

Periodic assessment of students was done along with their assessment at the end of semester. It was found that the course benefitted the students in terms of attitudinal changes and greater confidence. The course received an overwhelming response from the students whose skills in spoken English speaking and confidence level has improved.
